### King David

## WEEKLY WORD: ATONEMENT



**OPEN YOUR BIBLE TO THE BOOK OF 1 PETER.**

**READ** 1 Peter 2:22-25

**THINK** These verses tell us that Jesus did not sin at all. Our word for this week is atonement, which means that Jesus' blood washed away the dark stain of sin in my heart. Jesus had to be perfect to fix this. Jesus never sinned, even when He was being hurt.

**PRAY** God, thank you for sending perfect Jesus to die to fix my friendship with You.



**OPEN YOUR BIBLE TO THE BOOK OF 1 PETER.**

**READ** 1 Peter 2:22-25

**THINK** Verse 24 says that by Jesus' wounds you have been healed. Jesus was perfect and only deserved good things, but instead, He suffered and was hurt and died. Your friendship with the Father could only be fixed by a perfect person dying for you. How does that make you feel?

**PRAY** God, thank you for making me free from my sin.



**OPEN YOUR BIBLE TO THE BOOK OF 1 PETER.**

**READ** 1 Peter 2:22-25

**THINK** Verse 24 also says that Jesus bore our sins so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. What does it mean that we should die to sin? It means that we are to say no to sin, and not let it win us over. Write down some sins that you need to say no to. How can you say no to them this week? Now spend some time thanking Jesus that He died so that sin doesn't have to win anymore.

**PRAY** Jesus, thank you for being my Shepherd and watching over me.

### Proverbs 3:3-7 ESV

LOOK BEYOND THE WORDS

**TRUST:** Be confident, be bold, be sure ... not in me but in God

**HEART:** The center of everything inside a person ... Feelings + knowledge

**LEAN:** Illustrate it: Hold a railing as you walk upstairs. What if the railing was not solid and safe?

**UNDERSTANDING:** Knowledge

**WAYS:** A course of life (Spend a few moments reminding your child of a big change or decision that your family made. This is a "way," a course of life.)
